Have you ever heard a foreign country on the AM broadcast band while driving in your car or just listening to the radio? Canada should be easy, and Cuba and Puerto Rico can be heard most early mornings. Since Marconi, people have wanted to see how far they could hear.

A domestic broadcaster like WBZ is only concerned about being heard in a local geographical area. Predicting where the signal will land outside of this area can be a little more of a challenge, but it is thrilling when you hear a local AM station from Japan, India, or China on Cape Cod.

Noted DXer (radio distance hunter) Chris Black, whose domestic and Canadian trips to beaches and mountains just to “see” how far away he could hear stations, will present “Broadcast Band DXing and Short Wave Radio” on Saturday, March 13, 2010 at 1:00 p.m., at the Irving K. Zola Center for Persons with Disabilities, 20 Hartford Street, Newton Highlands, MA 02461. His journeys have been published in international short-wave radio hobbyist magazines. Chris will be a guest of the Zola Center.

Radio DXing is a world-wide, multi-faceted hobby that you can pursue your entire life and spend as little or as much as you want. You don’t need to be an engineer or very technically inclined. Chris will describe his adventures and demonstrate entry-level radios, as well as some of the more sophisticated units available today, and will show how computers are revolutionizing short wave radio technology.

There is something addictive to listening in to broadcasts from the next city, state, country, and continent!
